Dear Mr. Benson:

On June 22, 1942, I submitted an opinion in the matter of the request of Mr. Frank Markiewicz, agent for the Polish Falcons of America, Inc., for a refund of \$25.00 for a special license issued by the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas, to sell beer on the premises known as the 3700 block of East Monument Street.

I therein concluded that under the law, Article 2B, Section 26 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), as amended by Chapter 849 of the Acts of 1941, there is no authority to grant this request for a refund as the same did not come within any of the provisions of the law authorizing a refund.

You have asked me to investigate this matter further and reconsider the same. It now develops that the license in question was authorized by the Liquor Board, in error. On May 16, 1942, Mr. James D. Shea, Secretary of the Liquor Board, seems to have recognized this, because he wrote to Mr. Herbert Fallin, Budget Director, stating "that the issuance of this license was authorized by us but it later developed that the club was not qualified for the type of license applied for, and it was necessary for us to recall the license." Mr. Shea concluded this letter by requesting Mr. Fallin to refund to Mr. Markiewicz the \$25.00 which he paid for the same.

If this matter is treated as a request for a refund, I am still of the opinion that there is no authority to grant the same. However, it appears from my investigation, and further consideration of this matter, that the error authorizing the issuance of the license was that of the Liquor Board and not the applicant. The City, therefore, has in its possession money to which it is not entitled; and the question now resolves itself whether the Board of Estimates will as a matter of simple equity give back to the applicant the \$25.00 for the license erroneously authorized by the Liquor Board.

Under the circumstances, I have reconsidered the matter and I am of
