Dear Sir:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of June 15, 1942, enclosing a letter of June 8, 1942, from Mr. Eugene S. Williams, Vice-President and General Counsel of the Western Maryland Railway Company.

Mr. Williams quotes from Paragraph 6 of the contract dated December 29, 1926, between the City and the Railway Company (see Ordinance No. 965, approved February 6, 1927), requiring the Railway Company during the life of the contract, or any renewal thereof, "to insure and keep insured, at its own expense, against fire, the structures and facilities which the City is to construct . . . in such an amount as is customary on similar structures and facilities," and says that the
