

as in the fourth section of an ordinance of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, being Ordinance N. 69 approved on or about the 16th day of May 1864 and entitled "An ordinance to open a street in continuation of Holliday Street, from Baltimore Street to Second Street," it is enacted and ordained that in the settlement with William W. McClellan or Catharine M. Raborg for any Damages which may be awarded him or her for property condemned under provisions of said ordinance, there shall first be deducted the amount of two orders upon the Collector or Register of the City, the one in favour of A. Horn & Co. and the other in favor of the proprietors of the Holliday Street Theatre, which were received in payment of the assessments upon those parties, under the provisions of ordinance N. 59 approved October 21st 1858, and of interest upon the same, and that upon the settlement by the said William W. McClellan or Catharine M. Raborg of the amount of the order aforesaid in favour of A. Horn & Co., with interest thereon, the Register of the City is directed by the aforesaid ordinance and fourth section thereof, to pay the same over to A. Horn & Co. or to credit the amount upon any assessment which may be levied upon them under the provisions of this ordinance. — And whereas also in and by the fifth section of the same ordinance, it

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
