

Philadelphia 13th Feb. 1832

Sir

Yours of the 8th Inst. is before me
and its contents noted, when I say to
you that I have been more like dying
than living I trust it will be a satis-
fying apology for my silence, yet
notwithstanding my indisposition I frequ-
ently requested Mr Whimur to stimulate
the Spy respecting your man, as the
