

the proprietors of the several lots of ground on that part of Bond Street, that lies between Alivanna Street and Lancaster Street, have privilege to extend their several lots westward, as far as the west side of Eden Street. - which said lots so extended shall be the sole right and absolute property of the present proprietors: Provided nevertheless, That the said proprietors shall be obliged to fill up said Lots to such height as the City Commissioners may direct. -

II. And be it enacted and Ordained, That it shall be the duty of the Commissioners of Health, immediately to examine said Lots, and direct the proprietors thereof to fill up such parts as may be by them considered a nuisance, allowing a reasonable time for the completion of the same, as in case of other nuisances. And if the said proprietors shall refuse or neglect to comply with such order, the Commissioners of Health may proceed to fill up said nuisance at the expense of the proprietors: Provided that all the Streets, Lanes and Alleys, ranging with the several extended Streets, Lanes and Alleys, shall be the property of the public, and not the property of said proprietors. -

A Supplement to the Ordinance to encourage the Introduction of Water into the City of Baltimore. -

I. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. That the President and Directors of the Baltimore Water Company, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered (under and subject to the Conditions and provisions contained in the Ordinance to which this is a Supplement) to convey water to the Southern point or corner of the Wharf on the West side of the Centre Market Space, and to erect a Hydrant at that place for the supplying of water to Shipping, and to erect such building as may be necessary to secure the Hydrant and implements to be used therewith, provided such Hydrant and building shall not occupy a Space exceeding One Hundred square feet of ground. -

II. And be it enacted and Ordained, That if any person or persons shall willfully do or cause to be done, any act whatsoever, whereby the said Works, or any Apparatus, or implements belonging thereto, shall be stopped, obstructed, impaired or injured, the person or persons so offending shall forfeit and pay a Sum not exceeding twenty dollars One half to the informant and the other half to the use of the City. -

An Ordinance for leasing the City Hospital, and the Grounds thereto belonging.

I. Be it enacted and Ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to lease the City Hospital and the grounds thereto belonging to Colin Mackenzie and James Smythe, and to the survivor of them, for the term of fifteen years, on the following Conditions, viz. The Lessees Covenanting, that the said buildings be exclusively appropriated as an Hospital or Infirmary, for the Reception of Maniacs and diseased persons of every description, and that they will receive all City Patients that may be placed under their care, or sent to the said Hospital by the Commissioners of Health or other persons authorized by the Corporation, and provide for them Board, lodging, Nurses and Medical attendance, at the Rate of fifty Cents each per diem, or should the number exceed thirty, at such lesser sum as shall be agreed on between them and the Commissioners of Health with the approbation of the Mayor, or it shall be optional with the Mayor to furnish all necessary Nurses, Supplies, provisions and Medicines for said Patients, which the said Lessees shall cause to be faithfully administered, the Corporation in case of death of any of their Patients, to defray the funeral expenses. The Lessees also Covenanting that they will use their best endeavours to obtain from the Legislature of the State of Maryland, a grant of a sum of Money, or a Law authorizing a Lottery to raise a sum for erecting additional buildings, and improvements on the said Grounds for the purpose aforesaid.
