For paving cross streets (including balance due) four thousand one hundred and twenty-six dollars.

For the repairs of fire plugs and cisterns a sum not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars.

For the payment of ground rent at the City Hall including arrears, four hundred and sixty-nine dollars and twenty-cents.

For the payment of ground rent, on lot at the corner of West and Market streets, (Lells, Point) fourteen dollars and eighty cents.

For the payment of ground rent on the lot at Burn alley, twelve dollars and fifty cents.

For the payment of ground rent at the Lexington Market, two hundred and twenty-eight dollars.

For the payment of water rent at the Centre Market, four hundred and fifty dollars.

For the payment of water rent for the plug at the Centre (Fish) Market and at the Hanover Market, each for twelve months, ending May 1st eighteen hundred and thirty-one, forty dollars.

For fuel a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars.

For repairs of pumps and walls, including balance, a sum not exceeding six thousand dollars.

For paying the expenses of City Elections, a sum not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars.

For assessing specific tax, a sum not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars.

For the use of widows and orphans of those who fell in the battles of Bladensburg and North Point, and the bombardment of Fort M'Henry, to be expended as prescribed by resolution approved April 1st 1826, a sum not exceeding three hundred and fifty dollars.

For the expenses and repairs of the Jail, from the 26th February, 1831, to the 26th February, 1832, to be paid to the Visitors and Governors, having been ascertained and certified by them, a sum not

exceeding three thousand five hundred dollars.

For the payment of the salary of the Mayor, two thousand dollars.

For the services of the Register, and the service of each assistant as he may find it necessary to employ, fifteen hundred dollars.

For the City Comptroller six hundred dollars.

For the salaries of the City Commissioners (each seven hundred and fifty dollars) twenty-two hundred and fifty dollars.

For the Clerk of the City Commissioners and Wardens of the Port, six hundred and fifty dollars.

For the Commissioners of Health, (each six hundred dollars) eighteen hundred dollars.

For the Clerk of the Commissioners of Health five hundred dollars.

For the consulting Physician, four hundred dollars.

For the Superintendants of Streets and Pumps (each four hundred and fifty dollars) twenty-two hundred and fifty dollars.

For the Keeper of the Powder Magazine, six hundred dollars.

For the Weigher of Hay at the Belle-Air Market Scales, four hundred and fifty dollars.

For the Weigher of Hay at the Lexington Market Scales, three hundred dollars.

For the Keeper of the City Springs (each two hundred dollars) six hundred dollars.

For the Keeper of the fish-houses, one month's salary from February 1st to March 1st 1831, twenty-five dollars.

For the Keeper of the Public Walk, one hundred dollars.

For the Clerk of the Centre Market, five hundred dollars.

For the Assistant Clerk of Centre Market, three hundred dollars, and for taking care of the Centre Fountain, payable quarterly, twenty-five dollars.

For the Clerk of the Lexington Market, three hundred and fifty dollars.

For the Assistant Clerk of Lexington Market one hundred and fifty dollars.
