For the clerk of the Hanover Market, three hundred dollars.

For the clerk of the ^{the} Bell Point Market, three hundred dollars.

For the clerk of the Belle-Air Market, one hundred and fifty dollars.

For the City Messengers, four hundred and fifty dollars.

For the City Bailiff, seven hundred and fifteen dollars.

For the Justices of the Night Watch (each hundred dollars) three hundred dollars.

For the services of the Keeper of the Court House, three hundred dollars, and for purchased fuel for the Court House, one hundred and fifty dollars, to be paid out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, in anticipation in the Levy for those purposes.

For the purpose of better securing the walls and making a pass-way, to the improvements on the west side of Canal Street, as per resolution of February 3rd 1831, two hundred and thirty-three dollars and seven cents.

For winding, cleaning and oiling the town clock, fifty dollars.

For keeping in repair and use, the alarm bell in the steeple of the German Reformed Church in Second Street, a sum not exceeding forty dollars.
