That the Register of the City be, as he is  
heroby authorized, to contract annually with  
the proprietors of all the daily newspapers of  
the City, or with such of them as he can, for  
publishing the ordinances of the Mayor and  
City Council, the proceedings of the first and  
second branches of the City Council daily,  
and also all proclamations of the Mayor, and  
notices, &c. from the Officers of the Corporation,  
from time to time, Provided that the com-  
pensation of each daily newspaper shall not  
exceed the sum of one hundred dollars.  
Approved January 11<sup>th</sup> 1831.
