Be it Resolved, by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, that a committee composed of His Honor, the Mayor, and two members of the first, and two of second Branches of the City Council, be appointed by the respective Presidents of each, to proceed to the City of Washington, and request the Representatives and Senators in Congress from the State of Maryland, to urge upon Congress the speedy passage of a bill making appropriation for Fortifications at Sellers' Point on the Patuxent River
