Penalty.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted and ordained, That for each and every violation of this ordinance, the offender upon conviction thereof, shall be liable to a fine of five dollars and costs, to be recovered as other fines and costs for violation of ordinances and resolutions of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore are now re covered.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted and ordained, That this ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its approval.

An Ordinance appropriating seventy-nine thousand four hundred and five dollars and thirty-seven cents to pay the cost incurred by the City for opening McCulloh street, from Biddle street to Eutaw street.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That the \$79,405.37 ap. sum of seventy-nine thousand four hundred propriated. and five dollars and thirty-seven cents be, and the same is hereby, appropriated to defray the cost incurred by the City for opening McCulloh street, from Biddle street to Eutaw street, said amount to be taken out of the sum of three hundred thousand dollars of bonds set apart for

paying the benefits assessed to the City for the opening and widening such streets as the Mayor and City Council shall specially provide for by ordinances, in the ordinance authorizing the issue of six million dollars of bonds for payment of public improvements, approved October 7th, 1892; and the Commissioners of Finance are hereby authorized to sell, from time to time, bonds for this purpose, and pay the proceeds to the City Register, to be applied on the warrant of the Comptroller to the above named purpose, and to no other purpose.

An Ordinance authorizing the Commissioners for Opening Streets to accept surrenders of portions of lots taken for opening streets, and regulating the time and manner in which sales of materials and of lots of ground by the Commissioners for Opening Streets shall be made.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, That in every case where it shall be necessary in order to effect the object proposed under any of the ordinances providing for laying out, opening, widening or straightening, in whole or in part, any street, square, lane or alley, that a part only of a lot, or of a lot and improvements, shall be
